Southwire CARES (Creating a Realm of Extraordinary Service) is focused on sustainably growing its impact within our company and the communities where we live and work. Our commitment to Giving Back is unwavering as we seek to improve the quality of life for Southwire team members and those around us.

I am extremely proud of the efforts made by Project GIFT throughout 2023. I want to thank our more than 1,900 volunteers who donated their time and efforts in 28 Giving Back communities across the world. Southwire team members donated more than 16,000 hours of service in 2023. From providing assistance to those affected by tornadoes in the southeast, to supporting survivors of the devastating wildfires in Hawaii, Project GIFT's impact is an inspiration to us all. Our signature giving back events, Back to School, Disaster Relief, Toys for Tots and Walk for Water, collected nearly half a million in donations in 2023, 16 percent more than the previous year.

Southwire's POWER Fund remains a vital resource to our team members, providing support as they navigate the challenges that accompany unforeseen hardships. This unique resource celebrated its 18th anniversary in 2023 — hitting a huge milestone, giving out more than 450 grants to team members in the form of matching and catastrophic grants for short-term, emergency assistance to team members and their families, totaling almost \$850,000, and topping 12 million dollars in all time distribution. Giving Back is an integral part of our company culture and our ongoing commitment to sustainability, and we continue to encourage team members who do not donate to the POWER Fund to consider doing so.

Southwire's people truly embody the spirit of Giving Back — both within the Southwire walls and throughout our communities.

Back To School

In July 2023, Southwire's Project GIFT* hosted its 19th annual Back to School Giveaway at Midway Church in Villa Rica, GA, providing over 4,500 bags of school supplies to local community members across west Georgia. The drive-thru setup ensured safe distribution, with 100+ volunteers assisting over 500 vehicles.

23 additional Southwire locations also hosted community distribution events or partnered with local school systems and nonprofit organizations to give away free school supplies to K-12 children in need across their communities. Sites that hosted community-facing events included Douglas, GA, Starkville, MS, Arlington, TX, Denton, TX, Bremen, IN, Huntersville, NC and Mississauga, Canada. In total, more than 30,000 bags were distributed.

Disaster Relief

Southwire Project GIFT volunteers provided assistance in Starkville, MS by filling and sending more than two tractor trailers of much needed relief supplies following severe weather that tragically claimed the lives of at least 26 people and inflicted extensive damage on numerous residences and businesses in the Southeast. Furthermore, in response to the wildfires in Hawaii, Southwire partnered with Feeding America to offer financial aid for relief efforts on the island. To amplify our impact, Southwire matched the first \$10,000 in team member donations, effectively doubling our contributions and enabling us to send over \$16,000 towards the relief endeavor.

Toys For Tots


Southwire's Project GIFT hosted its annual toy drive in Carrollton, Ga., supporting Carroll County Toys for Tots and spreading joy to families across west Georgia. With the overwhelming support of Southwire team members, partners, volunteers, and local residents, the event surpassed expectations, collecting over 6,200 toys — with the initial goal of 5,000. 
Walk for Water

Southwire's Project GIFT, in collaboration with Water Mission, organized a meaningful event aimed at addressing the global water crisis impacting billions worldwide. The Walk for Water initiative, central to this endeavor, united communities across multiple Southwire facilities, culminating in a collective CARES donation of \$31,171 and total company donation of \$47,171. These funds will support communities in Honduras and Mexico, where Southwire operates facilities. This endeavor highlights our dedication to addressing the water crisis, with special recognition given to Southwire's Bremen location, which raised nearly \$1,000 as our top team fundraiser. Additionally, the inaugural event in Honduras drew over 90 enthusiastic participants. These achievements were made possible through the support of community sponsors, and the water collected during the event was recycled for use in Southwire's manufacturing processes, furthering our sustainability efforts.

The POWER Fund Advisory Council




